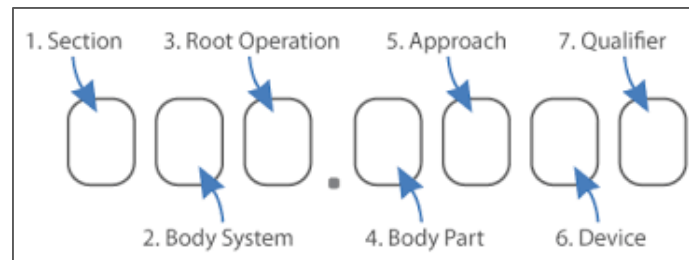

Yes, it's really going to happen

As of October 1, 2015, we will switch over to ICD-10. This is a beneficial and necessary transition. More detailed data improves diagnosis and outcomes.

- Benefit from **higher reimbursements**. More information on diagnosis and treatments results in higher repayments.
- **You don't need to learn every code**. Focus on the codes relevant to your specialty or practice. Pick the top 25-50 used in your practice to create cheat sheet.
- Your practice management software can **help streamline the conversion**.

Procedure Structure	ICD-9-CM <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3-4 characters • All characters are numeric • All codes have at least 3 characters 	ICD-10-PCS <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ICD-10-PCS has 7 characters • Each can be either alpha or numeric • Numbers 0-9; letters A-H, J-N, P-Z

EHR Features That Can Help

- Multiple Favorites Lists
 - Organized just for you by criteria such as Body/Organ System, Acute/Chronic, Age, Specialty, etc.
- Renaming Favorite Diagnosis Codes (using the ICD-10 but with a shorter name that your providers will recognize)
- Edits
 - ICD-10 required for E&M Coding and/or Finalization
 - Billable CPTs Required to be Linked to ICD-10

EHR Features That Can Help

- GEMs/Cross Walk
 - Existing Diagnoses
 - New Diagnoses
- Support and Training
 - Personalized Training
 - Responsive Support Desk

GEMs...

GEM (General Equivalence Mapping) are a crosswalk tool developed by CMS that assist in converting code databases or large amounts of coding. GEMs were developed as a mapping tool and are not a substitute for diagnostic or medical coding expertise.

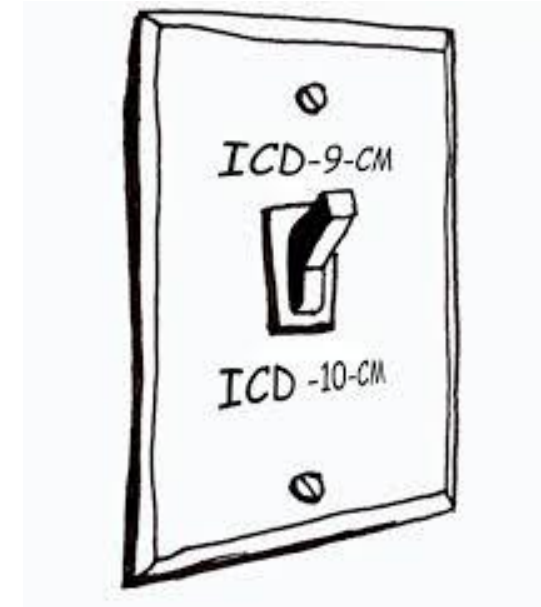
Questions to ask your EHR

Questions

- Is there a way to easily convert my patients' existing ICD-9 diagnoses to ICD-10?
- Is there a way to easily convert my favorites and templates from ICD-9 to ICD-10?
- Are there edits in place to require ICD-10 for DOS 10/1 and later? *

* The transition to ICD-10 is required for everyone covered by HIPAA

EHR Reports for ICD-9 to ICD-10

- ✓ Un-finalized encounters from 9/30/15 and earlier
 - ✓ Finalize ASAP to minimize overlap with ICD-10
- ✓ Un-finalized encounters 10/1/15 and later
 - ✓ Are they increasing?
 - ✓ Reasons not finalized?
- ✓ Run Now: Favorites and templates that have not been migrated to ICD-10 (if this feature is available)
